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What do Vice Chairs Do?

- Respond to event requests and schedule RACC events
- Collaborate with a team of event coordinators who help us successfully establish an event calendar
- Organize trainings and support other board members





RACC Signature Events

Mini Fair

- A portion of RACC schools will visit your high school to provide information, college fair-style
- Most popular RACC signature event, offered both fall and spring
- Typical schedule: 30 minute to 1 hour fair held before school, during lunch, nutrition, homeroom, or after school



Why Go Out of State Presentation

- This popular presentation provides students and their families with information about options that exist beyond California and the associated benefits of considering an out-of-state institution. Can be offered in conjunction with a mini-fair
- Offered in both fall and spring, during the school day, or in the evening
- Typical schedule: 45-minute for presentation and RACC member pitches, followed by a 45-minute fair



Case Studies

- Students and families are invited to participate in a mock admissions evening known as Case Studies. The organization contact will ask participants to prepare in advance by reading 3 sample college admissions applications. A college fair concludes the evening
- Most commonly held during the spring semester with juniors as the target audience, in the evening. Offered in the fall and spring, during the day or evening.
- Typical Schedule: 1.5 hours for application review and Q&A, then a 30-minute fair

Event Request Process

RACC Event Guidelines

- RACC requests that you do not invite any non-RACC colleges/universities or outside vendors to our events.
- RACC cannot guarantee or promise a certain number of member institutions will sign up for any event. Attendance is determined by reps' schedule and university goals.
- We cannot guarantee certain member institution will sign up. All RACC members are welcome to register for every RACC event but members have the right to choose which events they can and cannot attend.
- RACC and StriveScan are partnering this year! If you host a RACC event, it is an
 expectation that you help your students register for the event and promote
 StriveScan technologies. We'll talk more about what student registration means
 later on.

3. Your Vice Chair responds and begins to work on establishing an event and will provide input on a strategic date and time. We may connect you with an event coordinator.

4. A hold is placed on our RACC Event calendar when we have confirmed a date of interest but still need final details before approval.

- 5. Once all information is collected for the calendar, your Vice Chair will finalize the event on our calendar and create a Sign-Up Genius. Once this happens, your event will be promoted to membership.
- 6. Your event coordinator should provide you registration updates no later than a week before the event and/or sooner if required.

A Vice Chair needs all of this information before we confirm an event.

Your event coordinator should confirm this with you before the Vice Chair adds it to the calendar.



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The timeline of confirming an event takes time. Admissions reps confirm their travel schedules early and Vice Chairs aim to accommodate membership by having a finalized calendar early.

<u>Fall Events</u>: Aim to close **event requests mid-August** and finalize fall events no later than early September.

<u>Spring Events</u>: Aim to **close requests mid-January** and finalize Spring events no later than early February.

Other Event Resources

 When you have the desire for a presentation outside of the RACC Signature Events such as Financial Aid and How to Write an Essay. RACC promotes it internally, but cannot guarantee it will be filled

Event Promotion


